**Richard Enrietto** U.S. Army, KIA-ETO-Pfc Killed in Action in Europe

This is an article which appeared in the *Auburn Citizen* Friday, Feb. 9, 1945.

Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Enrietto of this city were notified the first part of the week, that their son, Pfc. Richard Enrietto was killed January 22 in Luxembourg.

Pfc. Enrietto entered the service in May, 1943 and received his basic training at Camp Robinson, Arkansas. In March 1944 he was sent to England with the 12th Infantry Division. Prior to going overseas, he was stationed at Ft. George Meade, Maryland.

Dick was injured in June in the Normandy invasion while serving with Hodges First Army and was awarded the Purple Heart in September. After recuperating in a hospital in France, he was sent back to combat duty.

Surviving are his parents; a twin brother F1/c Ray, serving in the Pacific and another brother John, Merchant Marine, stationed in Brooklyn, N.Y.; three sisters, Mrs. Celia Cacciatori, of this city; Dorothy of Springfield; and Mary Lou at home.
